

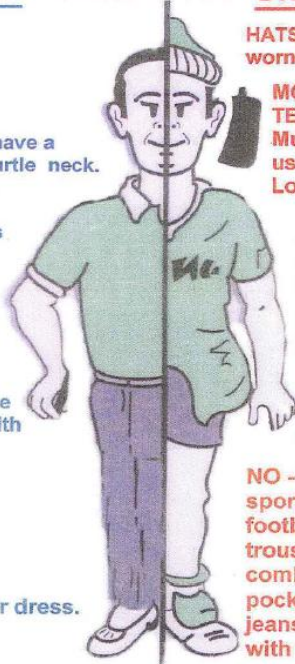
# North Manchester Golf Club

## Acceptable Dress Code Unacceptable

**SHIRTS** - Must have a collar, polo or turtle neck.  
**DRESS SHIRTS** may be worn outside trousers

**TROUSERS** - Trousers or knee length shorts with sports socks

**SHOES** - Smart casual or dress.



**HATS** - Must NOT be worn in the clubhouse

**MOBILE TELEPHONES** - Must NOT be used in the Main Lounges

**SHIRTS** - collarless, football or shirts with **LARGE** logos  
Golf shirts must NOT be worn outside trousers

**NO** - Tracksuits, sports shorts, football trousers, trousers with combat style pockets, denim jeans or trousers with studded pockets

**NO** - TRAINERS or WORK BOOTS

Normal Golf Course Dress and Etiquette apply at all times



## Members & Visitors Course Etiquette & Dress Code 2009/10



### ETIQUETTE OF GOLF

No one should stand close to or directly behind the ball, move or talk, when a player is making a stroke.

On the Putting Green no one should stand beyond the hole in the line of a player's stroke. The player who has the honour should be allowed to play before his opponent tees his ball.

No player should play from the tee until the party in front have played their second strokes, and are out of range, nor play up to the Putting Green till the party in front have holed out and moved away.

Players who have holed out should not try their putts over again when other players are following them.

Players looking for a lost ball should allow other matches coming up to pass them; they should signal to the players following them to pass and, having given such signal, they should not continue play until these players have passed and are out of reach.

**TURF CUT OR DISPLACED BY A PLAYER SHOULD BE AT ONCE REPLACED AND PRESSED DOWN WITH THE FOOT.**

Players should carefully fill up all holes made in a bunker.

Players should see that their caddies do not injure the holes by standing close to them when the ground is soft.

Players should at all times play without undue delay.

Any match playing a whole round may claim the right to pass a match playing a shorter round.

If a match fails to keep its place on the course it should allow the match following to pass.

It is expected that the courtesy of the Tee be extended to the Captain at all times.

(Note all times are flexible depending on the needs of the business. Notification of major changes in times will be posted on Club notice boards in advance)

The Club dress code must be adhered to at all times by members and guests both on the course and in the Clubhouse.

Play is not allowed prior to a competition unless space has been made available on the starting sheet.

The Captain and Lady Captain of the day have courtesy of the first tee at all times.

Rules relating to practice are displayed on the practice area and must be strictly adhered to at all times.

Members must not purchase golf balls on the course from anyone other than the professional or his staff.

Players may not practice on the golf course i.e. play more than one golf ball unless the rules dictate such action.

All members must at all times display their membership disc when playing on the course and should challenge anyone not displaying such or a visitors ticket.

#### New for 2010

Gentlemen golfers are requested to use the stepped walk-off areas on the 1st Tee and not use the back of the Ladies Tee as a cut through.

Players who are called through to drive to the green at the Par 3 9th and 18th must remain an acceptable distance from the green while the first group putt out.

Players approaching or on the 4th Tee must give courtesy to players putting out on the adjacent 1st Green

Where possible, players on the 4th Fairway should delay their shots into the 4th Green while players on the adjacent 5th Tee drive-off.
